Updates

Reopening of School:

On Thursday, August 6, 2020, we updated the Board of Education with RPS' Reopening Plan. Linked are the revised <u>RPS Reopening Plan</u>, and Presentation <u>here</u>. You can watch the BoE meeting <u>here</u>. Our new plan includes a 'Transition to Full' Hybrid for K-8 and a Hybrid in grades 9-12. Pre-K will open with full, in-person classes five days each week. School specific information regarding cohort and class assignments, schedules, and building procedures will be forthcoming from school principals and administrators on or around August 14. We will not have this information prior to this date. A communication will be sent in advance with

directions to access this information via Powerschool. Also, by August 14, the District will have a link on the main webpage with all 'Reopening' information.

Families who elect to have their students temporarily remote learn will be asked to complete this form: <u>Temporary Remote Learning Option</u>. This form is also available on our website. You may certainly do this now, or may wait until you have further details from your schools. Additionally, we ask that families complete this <u>Bus</u> <u>Ridership Opt-Out Form</u> if you do not intend on accessing the school bus (hybrid and/or full). We understand that these decisions are complex, and are family specific. Please do not hesitate to reach out to your school principal with any questions.
