The World Language Department leaders at Ridgefield High School (Allyson Power), East Ridge (Rebecca Gittens), and Scotts Ridge (Kristin Kleis) presented the RPS World Language program past, present, and future at Monday's Board of Education meeting. Leaders contrasted the previous textbook-centered way of teaching with the more dynamic, current approach flowing from middle school through Ridgefield High School. Powers highlighted the importance of aligning the program with the RPS Vision of the Graduate to encourage students to take risks in the language, develop respect for other cultures, curiosity, and proficiency. When Board Members asked about World Language at the Elementary School both



Assistant Superintendent Cory Gillette and Superintendent Da Silva, who is trilingual and started as a bilingual teacher, expressed interest. "This is part of our long-term goal," said Dr. Da Silva. "There is a lot to consider about how to fit it into the school day and how to pay for it." They also briefly discussed the criterion for which languages should be offered in this engaging conversation.

Student Shines Off-Broadway

Ridgefield High School freshman Dean Murray Trevisani received some exciting news recently when he learned he had been nominated for Broadway Worlds' 2021 Best Performance in an Off-Broadway play. Dean played Otto in *The Last*



Boy, which has also been nominated for Best Off-Broadway Play, Best Production, and Best Director. The play ran this summer and will reopen Off-Broadway on February 22 with a special Broadway benefit at Town Hall on April 27. According to the play's website, "The Last Boy in The Second Republic of SHKID is a work of historical fiction inspired by the incredible real-life events of Sidney Taussig and the boys of Dorm Number One in Terezin concentration camp who created the longest-running underground publication of the Holocaust." The play threads "poems, prose, and songs from the boys' magazine throughout this gripping story of human triumph told through the eyes of teenage boys." Dean performed in Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and Mary Poppins while at Scotts Ridge Middle School and will take Acting 2 at RHS in the spring.
