# It's Budget Time!

Every year, Ridgefield residents exercise their democratic rights through the budget process that culminates in a town-wide budget referendum on the second Tuesday in May. At Monday's Board of Education meeting, Superintendent Dr. Susie Da Silva presented her 2022-23 budget to the Board proposal Education and the public, which started the conversation about





District priorities, responsibilities, and challenges. On January 22, each RPS cost center will present details and answer questions during a full-day budget workshop open to the public. This is the second year of this one-day workshop that gives the public and the BOE context of the budget as a whole. In her introduction to this year's budget, Da Silva cites the ongoing effects of COVID-19 on RPS. She showed comparisons between budgets in RPS and other Districts in our District Reference Group (DRG). RPS welcomes the input of families, staff, and the Ridgefield Community in this important civic process.
