# New Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction

Ridgefield Public Schools Superintendent Susie Da Silva announced that Cory Gillette, MS.Ed. will be the new Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction. Ms. Gillette comes to Ridgefield from the Darien Public Schools, where she has worked since 2013, first as a Literacy Program K-12 Coordinator then K-5 English Language Arts and Social Studies Program Director.

Dr. Da Silva said Gillette's experience with Darien's K-12 curriculum alignment was critical to RPS's programmatic needs. "She has the experience to look at curriculum implementation at the elementary level to inform students' middle and high school success." Gillette's depth of knowledge with the Wilson, Fundations, and Orton-Gillingham approaches to literacy will be



particularly important. The District conducted an extensive search and found Gillette's knowledge of technology, literacy, curriculum, student assessment, and professional development for teachers to be unparalleled. Ms. Gillette will start on February 8. Please read the <u>full press release</u>.
