## Reopening of School

We are expecting to receive official guidance from the Connecticut State Department of Education on the reopening of school. This guidance is expected within the next week. Our Reopening Committee will continue to stay focused on Ridgefield and what is best for our community and students. Below is an update from Dr. Hannaway and Ms. Karen Dewing since our presentation to the Board of Education:

- The Steering Committee finalized the formation of the committee and membership and members have been notified of the subcommittee in which they will participate.
- The Steering Committee has developed reflection surveys to receive feedback from parents, grade 6-12 students, and staff on their experiences during the distance learning model in Spring 2020. If you received this survey, please make sure you complete it as the committee appreciates the feedback.
- Committee members were provided with an orientation video with an overview
  of the format of the work, such as the mission of the Reopening Committee,
  committee structure including scheduling of meetings, agenda and accessing
  the information as well as roles and responsibilities and timelines.
- The first subcommittee meetings are scheduled for the week of June 22, 2020.

#### SAT updates

Parents of rising 12-grade students should have received this important SAT update yesterday:

Ridgefield High School (RHS) will be offering an additional SAT-Day at no cost to all Seniors on Wednesday, October 14, 2020 **during the school day.** The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) will cover the cost of this test, however it will not include the Essay portion.

We appreciate the parent feedback re: SATs, and understand the difficulty that many are having to secure a seat at a nearby testing center. Our goal is to make sure that all of our students have access to the SAT here in Ridgefield.

More details about the October "SAT Day" will be provided when students return in the fall.

Please note that we will still be hosting the Saturday SAT on September 26, 2020. However, please note that students must register and a fee will be required.
