Elementary schools will be reaching out to families to offer before or after-school tutoring sessions for small groups of students in areas of need.

Health and Safety

Over the last six weeks there has been a very significant drop in the number of COVID-19 cases in Connecticut, Fairfield County and Ridgefield. This decline in cases has also been accompanied by a drop in hospitalizations. Data on cases and hospitalizations from the Town of Ridgefield can be found at this link.

Last week the CT Department of Public Health issued guidance about transitioning to a model of routine respiratory disease prevention and enhanced outbreak management and control for CT Schools. This document can be found at this link.

As of this past Monday, February 28, masking is now optional in Ridgefield Public Schools. The CT legislature has allowed the Commissioner of Education the legal authority to reinstate a statewide mask mandate before June 30 if conditions warrant.

With the lifting of the school mask mandate, COVID-19 protocols from the State of CT are still in place. These protocols can be found <u>at this link</u>. They include:

- Students and staff should not come to school if they have any symptom of COVID-19, however mild. Please contact your school nurse.
- Students will still have the ability to access quarantine learning if they meet the criteria.
- Students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 may return to school on day 6 after a positive test and must wear a mask in school through day 10 after testing positive.
- Students who test positive will not be allowed to participate in singing or playing of wind instruments through day 10 after testing positive.
- Unvaccinated individuals who are exposed to COVID-19 at home must isolate themselves at home and may not return to school until the 11th day after the positive family members' test; upon return to school they must wear a mask for 5 additional days.

If there is a case of COVID-19 in an elementary school classroom, or if we learn that your child ate lunch within six feet of a positive individual, you will be notified by your building administrator or school nurse via email.

RPS has acquired a significant number of rapid at-home tests. We currently have 3,600 test kits on hand with 4,500 more on the way. If RPS families or staff would like a test kit(s) for any reason you may obtain one by contacting your school nurse.
