School Lunch Program

The CSDE Child Nutrition Program has offered to extend the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) through December or until their Federal funds run out. We are in the process of filing our application with the State to continue this program for K-8 in school and for all distance learners including homeschooled children for meal pick up. The SSO program offers one free meal a day per student and allows for meals to be picked up to cover holiday and weekends. In addition to this exciting news, starting Wednesday September 16, 2020 in place of offering remote meal pickup during the day, we will be offering remote pick up of meals from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. at East Ridge Middle School on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays. More details on the SSO program to follow after the Districts application is approved.
